Fraternal correction

"St. Bartolo Longo was born to a devout Catholic family near Brindisi, in southern Italy. He was a brilliant, though mischievous kid, who began to lose his way at the age of ten after his mother died. His adolescence was a time of great upheaval in his country, when Garibaldi was seeking to eliminate the papal city states and unite Italy. By the time Bartolo entered the University of Naples law school, many of his professors were ex-priests preaching nationalist venom against the Church. He was quickly caught up in their fervor. "I, too, grew to hate monks, priests and the Pope," he would later write, "and in particular [I detested] the Dominicans, the most formidable, furious opponents of those great modern professors, proclaimed by the university the sons of progress, the defenders of science, the champions of every sort of freedom." In his confusion and emptiness, without God to turn to, he began to visit some of Naples' infamous mediums. That was his introduction into the occult. Soon, his thirst for the supernatural led him into outright Satanism, where after a period of intense study and such rigorous fasting that he was reduced to skin and bones, he was consecrated a satanic priest and promised his soul to a demon. For the next year, he began to preside over satanic services and to preach more boldly and blasphemously against God and the Church — treating them, in a diabolical reversal, as the real evils.

His family back home tried to talk to him about the path he had chosen, to no avail. They began to pray and to ask for help from whoever might lend a hand. Professor Vincenzo Pepe, a solidly Catholic professor at the university, responded. He began to meet with Bartolo, accosting him, "Do you want to die in an insane asylum and be damned forever?" Bartolo couldn't ignore the psychological and physiological state he was in. Professor Pepe eventually convinced him to see a Dominican priest, who after three weeks of lengthy conversations, on the feast of the Sacred Heart in 1865, was able to welcome him back into the Church and give him absolution". "Therefore, when in our own life or in that of others we notice something that isn't going well, something that requires the spiritual and human help which, as children of God, we can and ought to provide, then a clear sign of prudence is to apply the appropriate remedy by going to the root of the trouble, resolutely, lovingly and sincerely. There is no room here for inhibitions, for it is a great mistake to think that problems can be solved by omissions or procrastination" (San Josemaría Escrivá de Balaguer, Friends of God, n. 157). In this regard Pope Francis wrote in his Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Gaudium: "No one is saved by himself or herself, individually, or by his or her own efforts. God attracts us by taking into account the complex interweaving of personal relationships entailed in the life of a human community" (Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Gaudium, n. 113).

Building Prayer into Family Life

"Cultivating the habit of daily prayer prepares
our children to practice their faith in the world."

In the article "Building Prayer into Family Life," the author, Dallas Carter, is trying to explain why prayer should be an important and consistent part of family life. Carter encourages families to set aside time to pray together, whether it is at home, in the car, or before going to bed. He understands that families can become busy with school, sports, homework, and work, so he says it is important to be flexible while still making an effort to pray regularly.

He also explains that parents have a responsibility to set a good example because children learn from their parents' actions. If parents constantly make excuses not to pray, their children may begin to think that prayer is not important. However, when parents consistently pray and practice their faith, they teach their children the value of faith, love, mercy, and kindness.

Overall, Carter's main message is that families should make prayer a regular habit because it helps children build a strong and lasting faith and teaches them how to live out their beliefs in everyday life.
